My Walk in Faith ...

My Walk in Faith started the day I was born. Being born into a strong Christian family, those values were instilled in me from day one. I was one of six children (being the baby until I was 9 – then my little brother took that title away from me!).

I grew up on a farm outside of Deshler, across the road from our church – and that church was like my second home. Sunday morning church services and Sunday School, choir practices, Junior Lutherans, Catechism and Summer School. My best friends were my “church friends” so I was happy to attend anything knowing we’d all be together.

In addition to my family, I was very blessed to have had many other people that influenced my faith throughout my growing up years. Of course, there were my Sunday School teachers who were responsible for a lot of my “faith learning.” But one of the most influential people was Pastor Ballas. He had a way of getting through to me that no one else did. He was my Pastor, Catechism instructor, Summer School teacher, next door neighbor, and mentor. If he said it, I knew it had to be true. And if there was something I didn’t understand, he always

explained it in terms that made it seem so simple. After my father died of a massive heart attack when I was only 13, Pastor Ballas took me under his wing and also became a father-figure to me. We had a lot of heart-to-heart talks, and he made sure I was taken care of. I looked up to him like he was my father. I owe so much to him. He helped steer me in the right direction on my Walk in Faith. Unfortunately, he died before I was able to tell him just how much he meant to me. But I like to think that he knew.

When I was 17, my mother met a man and started dating – much to my horror. My older siblings thought it was great; however, I was not at all happy about the situation. We were getting along just fine, and my little brother and I had adjusted to not having a father. I didn’t need a stranger coming into our lives and trying to take his place. So, to put it simply, I wasn’t very nice to him and it was very uncomfortable at our house for a while. Then my older siblings decided it was time to take the matter into their own hands and sat me down, and in simple terms, told me how selfish I was being. They finally got through to me, and I gave her my blessing. They were married in December of 1976. If only I had know then that this man was

going to be one of the biggest influences in my life! Never have I met a man with a stronger faith than Eldon. He was the most loving, caring, honest, generous and genuine Christian man I have ever met. He refused to call us his “step-children” – we were his kids and that’s all there was to it. He treated me like his own daughter, and 5 years later I asked him to give me away at my wedding. He cried the whole way down the aisle. Just watching the way he lived helped to strengthen my faith. The fact that God gave me 2 wonderful fathers in my lifetime made me know that he truly loved me and cared about me. I was very, very blessed. In 2001, Eldon died after a very short illness. Watching him take his last breath was the hardest thing I’ve ever done in my life. I miss him every day.

My mom went through the loss of 2 husbands, but she was a real pillar of strength. She is my rock. When life gets tough, her faith gets stronger. She has taught me that there is nothing life can deal us that we can’t handle with God’s help. We just have to know enough to ask.

Pastor and Pat Updegraff also had a big impact on my Walk. I looked up to and respected them both and considered them good friends. When that whole episode took place, I wasn’t sure I wanted to continue being a member of Emanuel. But we stuck it out, and I’m so glad we did. We are so blessed to have Pastor Castello and Angela, and they will now continue to walk

along with me! I have learned so much from both of them.

I have been very blessed with a wonderful husband, 3 sons and a daughter-in-law. From the day Marv and I met in high school (standing next to each other in choir), music has been a big connection for us. I had sung in church choir since I was little, but it wasn’t until I met him that I really understood the significance of music in our lives. Praising God through music is so spiritually fulfilling, and it has played a large part in my walk in faith. From the day our kids were born (even in the womb) they have been exposed to music of all kinds, and they all have a passion for it as well. From singing in choirs, to singing or playing in bands, to singing at church, weddings, funerals, to musicals, to majoring in it in college – music plays a huge part in our family.

Marv and I have tried to instill our faith and values in our kids, and I feel we have succeeded. I am still learning every day, and hopefully they are, too. My walk in faith will continue until the day I die, when I can finally make my home in heaven and let all those who went before me know how much impact they had on my life!
